She is a former city manager, city planner, city councilor, wartime program manager in Kosovo, and Ashland High track alumna. When working in public service, Jamie has repeatedly developed a reputation of integrity and standing up for the people she's served. Says McLeod-Skinner,

"Government needs to know when to help, and when to get out of the way. Our region needs an active champion for rural communities and progressive solutions."

McLeod-Skinner is focused on jobs, economic growth, and healthcare. She is the latest in a growing field of challengers competing for the Democratic Party nomination to challenge longtime incumbent Congressman Greg Walden. Says McLeod-Skinner,
